Growing In Christ and Loving One Another

CPC Friends, at the beginning of our Sept. meeting, Session reflected briefly on the following quote from Craig Barnes:

Your mission is not to get to the right place in life; that is God's mission in your life. Your mission is to develop a grateful heart along the way. That is the only way you can be useful to God, when he finally gets you where he wants you. So you are not wasting time on all the wrong roads that led in the wrong direction; those are the roads on which you were learning how to be open to God. Our spiritual character is always best formed on the wrong roads.

Barnes shared this while commenting on Paul's missionary journey in Acts 16, and the ways the Spirit was at times resisting, redirecting, and leading Paul into very challenging situations (like imprisonment!). It's a timely reminder for all of us to ponder when we feel like we are on the wrong road, because God is likely doing some of his best work in and through us, despite all appearances to the contrary. And in God's sovereign hands, such experiences form in us spiritual character, a humble and grateful heart.

We reflected on the Parable of the Vineyard Workers on 9/24. I quoted Barbara Brown Taylor who asks:

When we read this parable, why do we tend so immediately to identify with the folks hired at the crack of dawn, the hardest workers, the so-called "deserving"? Who told you or me that we've been working for 12 hours? How do we know that just maybe our work totals the measly one hour after all?

Taylor imagines that in the parable, when the landowner improbably hands the one-hour pickers a full day's wage, there must have been hoots of laughter and some "Ain't we the lucky ones!" good-natured back slapping going on.

Where is that sense of joy and laughter in our own lives, in our church? Ain't we the lucky ones!? Ain't we the blessed ones!? We ought to be slapping each other on the back in joy rather than presuming to be those who have labored long and hard and deserve better, deserve more, who look at what the landowner offers us and scowl in discontent and ingratitude.

We may just be those I-hr workers after all. Not the greatest disciples in the world, not the most able laborers in the vineyard, we may have come late in the day, but the point is we've been invited and included! And not on the basis of our employment record or resumes or how much strategic value we add to the vineyard, but solely on the basis of God's mercy and grace in Christ Jesus.

May it give us cause for back-slapping gratitude, laughter and joy befitting our wondrous pay day and the blessed reality that God has chosen us and given us the most meaningful and life-giving work anyone could have, the work for which we've been created. Grace begets gratitude and gratitude begets generosity as we give ourselves to the work God calls us to for the common good.

Ephesians 2:8-10 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God - 9 not by works, so that no one can boast. 10 For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do.

Notes From Session

Session had a productive meeting via Zoom on September 19th, starting with a reflection on gratitude and expressions of thanksgiving for God's rich blessings. We all celebrated and gave thanks for the presence of Diane Wilson and her renewed health. It was her first Session meeting in about a year.

We approved the 2024 COLA for staff and approved Worship's motions for a new AV system and raising the left side of the chancel to make it all one level. The Session task force on remediations and reflooring reported that a contract has been signed to install Phase I flooring (hallways, nursery, choir room, fellowship hall). That work should commence in mid-October. The remediation of entry and sanctuary carpeting should also take place in the next month or so, and a contract for the new flooring installation in those spaces should be signed in the next few weeks.

Property reported on the completed concrete repair of the north landing, continued partnering with Mission on the Safe Parking site, and painting of all Phase I spaces (big thanks to Curt Nitschelm, Todd Peplin, and other members of Property!). Mission updated us on the plans for the Parking Lot Sale (which went splendidly!) and upcoming service opportunities.

Wellness announced a Grief Luncheon scheduled for December 7th - more details will be provided closer to the date. Finance reported that the financial status of the church remains solid, though giving slackened over the summer.

The Nominating Committee is working hard to discern God's leading and seek those they believe may be called to service as elders and deacons - please prayerfully consider whether God might be calling you to join in these vital ministries of the church, or to serve in other ways.

- 3) Call 541-548-4472 and Walt will pick them up at your location.


