At the Annual Meeting on 1/28/2024, Pastor Kevin announced to the congregation that serious health concerns made it necessary for him to resign, abruptly launching us into the next chapter of CPC.

As we embark on this difficult journey without a pastor, the CPC session will provide monthly updates to the congregation on the status of where we are in the transition process. The session is aware that we cannot do this work alone and will need the entire congregation to work as a team with the session as we determine the next steps.

We are pleased to have the Cascades Presbytery's commitment to stand with CPC on this journey. The Cascades Presbytery staff Brian Craker, (Transitional Executive Presbyter), Clark Scalera, (Presbyter for Clergy and Congregations) and Sarah Sanderson-Doughty (Conflict and Resolution Team) joined CPC March 2nd through 4th, providing support and commitment to walk alongside us during this time without a pastor. During their time at CPC, Rev. Brian Craker preached, and the team met with session, staff, and several congregational members to hear our concerns and anxieties.

Subsequently, they provided a summary of their time with CPC. Some highlights from this summary include:

Healthy qualities:

- * Tremendous love for the church and one another
- * Compared to churches in our presbytery of similar size, we have 4-8 times the reserves
- * Committed lay leadership over the years, several deeply dedicated to their areas <u>Unhealthy Qualities</u>:
- * Communication patterns
- * Lack of leadership training
- * Deferring maintenance <u>Recommendations</u>:
- * Institute annual leadership training
- * Hire a yearlong bridge pastor for preaching and pastoral care
- * Establish regular communication from session

Session is in the process of gathering resources to move to the next stage of our planning. We will report back next month.

Music Ministry April 2024



One of my favorite childhood services was the one Millwood Presbyterian did on Watchnight Saturday. We would gather in the chapel for contemplative time and prayers; then, we would light a candle and proceed around the block in silence. When we returned to the church, the pastor would knock on the big wooden door, and from inside, we would hear, "Whom do you seek?" Our response was, "We seek Jesus Christ." This would repeat two more times, then the door would open, and the pastor inside would exclaim, "He is risen!" we would respond with, "He is risen, indeed!" repeating this three times. This special service helped us recall what Christ's followers experienced and prepared us for the joyful Easter news.

So now, what comes next? Wikipedia says, "Eastertide or Paschaltime is a festal season in the liturgical year of Christianity that focuses on celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Preceded by Lent, it begins on Easter Sunday, which initiates Easter Week in Western Christianity and Bright Week in Eastern Christianity. Traditionally lasting 40 days to commemorate the time the resurrected Jesus remained on earth before his Ascension; in some western churches, Eastertide lasts 50 days to conclude on the day of Pentecost or Whitsunday."

In Eastertide, we sing songs that recall Christ's resurrection and focus on how our lives can follow in his footsteps. Gone are the somber, contemplative songs of Lent, but we should never forget what occurred during the 40 days of Lent and how that time prepares us to loudly proclaim the good news of Easter, "HE IS RISEN, INDEED!"

Financial Report



CPC continues to be blessed by the faithful giving to the works and ministries of the congregation. Our recent meetings with Presbytery included an analysis of our financial situation. Their report is that we have

4-8 times the financial resources compared to other congregations of our size in the Presbytery.

An annual review of 2023 finances and management, led by John Seitter over several weeks, was completed in late February. The format was provided by Presbytery and required the team to review specific details in 72 areas. The team of four reviewed records, accounts, and management details. During the review, the team found a few processes that could be improved, and these areas were brought to the attention of the pertinent individuals. The results of the review showed that "the financial documents of CPC fairly present, in all material aspects, the financial position of CPC as of Dec. 31, 2023." Those documents were summarized in the Annual Report of CPC.

At the start of 2023, our church had \$1,687,761 in Total Assets (cash and investments). During the year, we spent \$355,313 from our budget, over \$300,000 from our investment accounts (primarily construction), and more from our Designated Fund and Mission giving. Still, on Dec. 31, 2023, we had increased our Total Assets to \$1,749,339. About \$480K remains dedicated to capital improvements and \$50K to Pastor Salary support. An additional \$110K is held for our Designated Fund programs.

All this is to show just how blessed we continue to be by the faithful giving of our congregation and the decisions and bequeaths of previous generations for the future missions that we will have.

Wellness Ministries has purchased a second knee scooter to replace the scooter that was taken without being checked out. We also have purchased an infant car seat to be loaned out to anyone having a small visitor and needing proper seating for a short amount of time.

Emergency First Aide Stations

The Wellness Ministry of our church continues to work to create safety measures for our church. We have First Aid Stations in the Narthex, Nursery, and downstairs in the Youth Room. We also have two electronic defibrillators. One is located in the Narthex, and the other is located downstairs in the Youth Room. Over the years, we have purchased new pads and batteries for each machine to keep them functioning properly. We also anticipate holding an AED/CPR class led by the Redmond Fire Department for those interested in learning how the machines work and how to save a life with CPR skills. Health Tip - FACTS ABOUT FALLS

Millions of older people - those 65 and above - fall each year. Every year, 3 million older people are treated in emergency rooms for fall injuries. Over 800,000 patients a year are hospitalized because of a fall injury, most often a head injury or hip fracture.

(Health Tip continued)

More than 95% of hip fractures are caused by falling, usually by falling sideways. Many falls do not cause injuries. But one out of five falls does cause a severe injury such as a broken bone or head injury. This causes people to be afraid of falling and may cause people to cut down on their everyday activities. Fewer activities cause people to become weaker, increasing their chance of falling. Ask your doctor or healthcare provider to evaluate your fall risk and talk with them about specific things you can do to keep yourself well and active.

Here are a few ideas to reduce the risk of falling...

- \Rightarrow Ask your doctor to review your medications.
- ⇒ Talk to your doctor about taking a vitamin D supplement.
- ⇒ Do strength and balance exercises.
- $\Rightarrow Have your eyes checked.$
- ⇒ Make your home safer; get rid of things you can trip over.
- \Rightarrow Add grab bars outside your bathtub.
- \Rightarrow Put railings on both sides of the stairs.
- \Rightarrow Make sure your home has a lot of light and bright bulbs.
- \Rightarrow Take that extra minute to protect yourself, and be careful where you walk.
- \Rightarrow Use a walker or cane to help balance yourself
