Greetings CPC!

I hope you are savoring these early days of summer, warm days and cool nights, sunrises and sunsets. It's a time when things seem to slow down a bit, and the proliferation of wildflowers and other flowering plants and shrubs are a constant source of enjoyment for many of us and perhaps an inspiration to tend our own gardens.

I can't say things are slowing down in and around our church building this summer as we are doing a whole lot of tending and mending for our shared ministry and mission. In addition to taking out old carpeting, addressing damaged infrastructure, and preparing to put new floors in, we also met this week with AV specialists to try and put together a plan to revitalize our sound system and streaming capabilities in the near term.

For those who must worship with us remotely, the sound drops, sound interference, or breaks in the entire stream have been a far-too-frequent occurence, I know. I apologize for these frustrating issues and appreciate the feedback provided over the last many months. It's not for lack of skilled and dedicated staff and volunteers working in the sound booth that there has been so much wrangling with these issues. Those folks are getting much more out of our system each Sunday than can reasonably be expected!

Over the last couple months the software used to create slides for music and liturgy has had more frequent glitches, requiring more and more time (and sanity!) from Gina and Karen. This and the other recurring issues brought us to a point where the Worship Team and Session agreed that a comprehensive revitalization needed to be accelerated.

Worship is the most important thing we or any church does together, after all; it's the heart that pumps blood to all our other activities. Minimally, we need to ensure that those who are worshipping in person and those who are unable to worship with us in person - for health or other reasons - can all access a service with reliable audio and video, so that we all can listen for God's voice in our lives and life together, and hear the Gospel in song and sacrament, prayer and proclamation of the Word.

On that all-important note of hearing God's voice, I will end with a brief reflection on Henri Nouwen's book *All Things New* that I read recently (compliments of Dan Baumgartner). Nouwen notes that we often become deaf, unable to hear when God calls us and unable to understand in which direction he calls us. He says our lives thus become *absurd*, which comes from the Latin word *surdus*, which means '**deaf**.' In other words, a life without listening to God is an absurd one. A good life, Nouwen suggests, requires that we listen to God, who constantly speaks but whom we seldom hear. When we learn to listen, our lives become *abedient* lives. Nouwen uses that word, *abedient*, because it comes from the Latin *audire* (audio, etc), which means '**listening**.' So not listening (deaf) leads to an absurd life, but listening leads to an obedient one. That is worth pondering this summer!

Sometimes our busyness is just laziness, as Craig Barnes has observed, the refusal to do the hard work of slowing down and *listening* for God's still small voice. My prayer is that we would find our lives and life together marked by a posture of careful listening and joyful obedience to God's call in the months ahead. The Lord be with you!

Health Tip - How To Deal With Summer Weather

The summer months and warm weather are with us, and we must prepare for a safe and fun time with our friends and family. Listed below are some suggestions to stay safe.

I. Drink plenty of water to stay adequately hydrated. Carry a water bottle with you wherever you go.

2. Hot cars kill. Never leave children, older people, or pets in a parked car.

3. Keep cool. Seek out air-conditioned buildings, and close your curtains. Use a fan, take cool showers, and dress in light, loose clothing.

4. Plan ahead. Plan activities in the coolest part of the day and avoid being outdoors in the hottest time of the day from 12:00 noon to 3:00 pm. Use plenty of sunscreen.

5. Check in on others. Look after those that are at risk in the heat. Your

neighbors living alone, the elderly, young people with medical conditions, and don't forget your pets.

During extreme heat, it is easy to become overheated. You may develop heat cramps, heat exhaustion, or even heat stroke, which is a medical emergency. Extreme heat can also make existing medical conditions worse. Be sure to check with your primary care physician for any questions or additional information.

Safe Parking Program at CPC



Session has approved a Mission Team proposal that our church serve as Redmond's seventh host location for the Safe Parking Program. This program is operated by Mountain View Community Development and partially funded by the City of Redmond. The goal is to provide two houseless families with a safe place to temporarily park and live

in their RVs or trailers while they work with the program's Case Manager to transition to stable housing. Participants will be parked near the shed and back fence of our property. This will likely begin sometime this summer after the Property Team has done some electrical work and dealt with the rock chucks and their tunnels that could be a liability hazard.

Participants are carefully screened and given background checks, and they must follow a strict set of contract rules to live on the host site. These rules include no entry into the church unless invited, no contact with church people (other than a small team of volunteer contact people) or program participants on site like schools or Scouts, no alcohol or illegal drugs, no weapons, no outside storage of possessions, no fires or grills, and quiet hours. In addition, the Safe Parking Program provides insurance, a portable toilet service, and a garbage service. Most participants at Safe Parking locations have jobs and need a safe place to live temporarily until they can get into permanent housing.

Other churches in Redmond and Bend have successfully hosted families during the past two years without impacting the church or outside programs like schools that use the church space. Families have a time limit of 90 days, which they can extend if they have shown progress in meeting their goals needed to transition to permanent housing. Our Session and Mission Team feel that providing a parking space for the houseless meets the purposes outlined for us in Matthew 25:40 by helping "the least of these." Our church can provide these spaces easily, at little or no cost to us, and with the knowledge that safety is a primary focus of the program.
