#### **Session Update**

Session met on September 17th, with Moderator Rev. Ann Bowersox. We reviewed a letter from Rev. Clark Scalera, Advocate for Congregations and Clerk, Presbytery of the Cascades. His letter supported our work with Genesis Christian Mediation, knowing they would be a beneficial resource in building a healthy congregation and providing helpful communication tools. Clark also addressed the disappointing news regarding our search for a Bridge Pastor. Rev. Bowersox led a session in a debriefing regarding the candidate's decline from the Bridge Pastor position.

Brian Shiner and Andrew Arthur of Genesis Christian Mediation introduced themselves and their work. They will do an assessment before foundational skills are addressed. Genesis will cover cycles of conflict within leadership and session, communication patterns, different narratives, grief within the congregation regarding recent pastoral transitions, lack of vision/understanding for the mission of the church and stewardship of resources. The Genesis team ended their Zoom connection and session continued their discussion regarding workshops. Session approved hiring Genesis to work with our session, deacons, and congregation, accepting their proposal for \$3200 and travel costs. Linda Jackson-Shaw will contact Genesis about workshop dates.

Team reports were given.

The Moderator of Deacons reported that Angelfest will be Nov. 9th, 9:00–3:00 pm. The Angel Tree program is underway, with gift cards for children at \$40 and a family gift card at \$150. October 16th is the next Pot Luck dinner. Steve continues contacting parishioners and making home visits.

<u>The Wellness Team</u> continues to offer Blood pressure checks. Singles lunch is scheduled for October 17th.

Session approved Rick Hoffman, Luann Johnson, and Linda Jackson-Shaw to complete an interim pastor job description.

<u>Congregational Life</u> reported that the Church BBQ was a success. A White Elephant Christmas party will be held on December 7th.

The Mission Team reported that they distributed many funds to local non-profits in the Redmond area. Quilters purchased a refrigerator for the lower-level kitchen. Canyon Cleanup is scheduled for October 12th from 9-11 am and Helping Hands is scheduled for November 16th from 9-11 am.

<u>The Property Team</u> presented a motion to allow Juniper Springs Assisted Living to use our building as an emergency evacuation site. Motion approved.

<u>The Preschool</u> has signed the lease agreement. They are finalizing the general liability insurance policy. Session approved the removal of the slide and the sale of the air hockey and pool tables.

<u>The Worship Team</u> reviewed the pulpit supply schedule through October. There will not be a Christmas cantata, but possibly an Easter Cantata. December 29th will be a Christmas carol sing. Piano tuning is being scheduled. The Livestream issues continue to be resolved.

Session adjourned at 9:00 pm and closed with a prayer by Rev. Ann Bowersox. The next Session meeting is October 15th, 2024, at 6:00 pm.

## **Music Ministry October 2024**

Reformation Sunday is celebrated by Presbyterians on the last Sunday of October, which will be October 27th this year. This day commemorates the Reformation, particularly Martin Luther's posting of his 95 Theses in 1517.

As Christians, our faith began with the followers of Jesus, but the beginning of demonstrating our faith as Presbyterians is in the Reformation. The focus is on the Holy Spirit's ongoing reforming of us as a church and as individuals. We are called to worship the triune God, to claim Jesus Christ as Lord of the Church, and to seek the ongoing sanctification of the Holy Spirit. Reformation reminds us to strive toward the real-life freedom of grace in Christ for ALL people.

The reformation challenged the authority of the Catholic Church, introduced new types of music such as Psalters and chorales, and worked to make the music more user-friendly for the congregations. Music was designed to lead people closer to God and was designed to be simplistic, so the worshiper would not be distracted. When we sing the music of the Reformation, like "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God," Luther's commentary on Psalm 46 is designed to provide comfort in the face of adversity; or "The Church of Christ, in Every Age," written by Fred Pratt Green in 1969 to remind us that the Reformation wasn't just confined to 1517 and that the church is constantly changing but must remain Spirit-led; or the modern worship classic "Here I Am to Worship" which Tim Hughes wrote to remind us that the reason we gather to worship is because Jesus came to us and is for us, we remember that we are a reformed people and that the Holy Spirit is at work reforming us daily.

I - Collect at Home: Please gather your cans and bottles at home.


2 - Stay Tuned: Keep an eye out for announcements; we'll provide further details soon.
