## **Music Ministry November 2024**

On Reformation Sunday, I hope you enjoyed singing songs that were composed between



1529 and 2009. They serve as a reminder that no matter the year of composition, we are a reformed people and the Holy Spirit is at work reforming us daily.

Our sending song on Reformation Sunday was by a good friend and wonderful composer, Ben Brody. Don and I were blessed each week by the thought-provoking, integrative music that Ben selected for the worship services at Colbert Presbyterian in Spokane, WA.

Ben will be at CPC on Sunday, November 10th, from 12:30–2:30 to lead us in an "At the Weaving of Creation Hymn Festival", where he will introduce us to 12 or more songs from his latest hymnbook. Everyone is invited to come and learn the stories behind his music and to sing through them. This is the second book of hymn tunes Ben has created. The debut of "At the Weaving of Creation: Fifty New Hymn Tunes" happened at Colbert Presbyterian a few months ago. We had a LARGE turnout, and I would love to have as many attend this event.

Ben currently serves as Chair of the Music Department, Professor of Music, and Director of Church Music Studies at Whitworth University. His hymn tunes have appeared in over a dozen hymnals and published hymn collections. Ben is bringing 60 copies of his hymnbook, which can be purchased, but no purchase is necessary. I guarantee this will be a worshipful experience that you will thoroughly enjoy. Put November 10th on your calendar. You won't want to miss it!

## Finance Update

Aren't we living in interesting times? We find ourselves without a pastor, but find church leadership developing within the congregation. We miss the experience of personal ministry from an individual, but find that ministry developing from a ministry of Deacons and one another. That seems so biblical! To me, the congregation seems stronger and more cohesive in these last months, even as we await a called pastor.

The church budget for 2024 was planned to end the year at a deficit, yet revenues are actually ahead of projections while expenses are obviously reduced. Meanwhile, special gifts to our church continue to arrive, such as a recent bequest from the Hodecker estate. CPC is in the top 10% of congregations of our size with the financial resources that we have.

This represents amazing gifts and legacy giving from saints of the church no longer with us, as well as faithful giving of our existing church family.



I want you all to realize that CPC has the financial resources necessary to continue our public ministry for many years. Investments have been made which can carry us forward into the new plan and leadership which God has in store for us. Session has approved a new pastor job description which is now being posted to Presbytery's website, with plans for additional outreach.

Finance team is beginning the budgeting process for 2025. Trusting in His providence, we will be including the expenses of a new pastor in that budget!

Join Linda for a Mental Health Bible Study on Wednesday, November 20th @ 1:00 in the Eby room. The class is free, but registration is required. Please email Linda at longjourneyhome40@gmail.com.

NAMI's signature programs are places where people and communities can find help, hope and healing. We encourage you to share or sign up for these programs if you or someone you know needs mental health support.

NAMI Basics: A six-session education program for parents, caregivers and other family members who provide care for youth (ages 22 and younger) who are experiencing mental health symptoms.

<u>NAMI Family-to-Family</u>: A free, eight-session educational program for family, significant others and friends of people with mental health conditions.

NAMI Family & Friends: A free 90-minute or four-hour seminar that informs people who have loved ones with a mental health condition how to best support them.

NAMI Homefront: A free, six-session program for families, caregivers and friends of military members and veterans with mental health conditions. Plus, find free online resources available 24/7.

NAMI In Our Own Voice: Free presentations that provide a personal perspective of mental health conditions, as leaders with lived experience talk openly about what it's like to have a mental health condition.

<u>NAMI Peer-to-Peer</u>: A free, eight-session educational program for adults with mental health conditions who are looking to better understand themselves and their recovery.

NAMI Support Groups: NAMI support groups are peer-led and offer participants an opportunity to share their experiences and gain support from other attendees.


You may either bring the filled bag back to CPC or take it yourself to scan at the BottleDrop Redemption Center. The address is 1204 SE Lake Road, across from Fisherman's Pond. The redemption door is on the left side of the building, with some parking. Scan the bag's label, open the door, then drop it in. Their website is bottledrop.com for more information.

If you would like to drop off your cans and bottles at CPC, please place the blue bag on the sidewalk to the left of the office door on Sundays.
